


WHAT'S IN A NAME?

Welcome to the season of Lent, a period in which Christians remember the events leading up to and including the death of Jesus, whose life and teachings are the foundation of Christianity.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 2. We will explore the different names we call Jesus in a sermon series titled What's in a Name? Names matter. What you call someone defines your relationship, your loyalty and your love. Jesus was called many names by his disciples. What they mean and how we interpret them can inform our relationship with Jesus. These titles teach us a lot about new ways to relate to Christ, and ways our lives can be transformed by him.

Reflecting on Scripture

Spending time reflecting on the meaning of scripture has been an integral part of the Christian tradition for nearly 2,000 years. Perhaps you have heard the process described as sitting with scripture/the Word and how scripture speaks, or even *Lectio Divina* (or Divine Reading). However it has been described, the practice of reflection is to allow scripture to move from our mindful processing of the words to the truth it speaks in our hearts. In other words, to allow the Holy Spirit to move us from the intellectual experience to the spiritual.

To reflect or meditate on scripture requires focused quiet solitude to allow the Word to permeate. Begin by sitting upright comfortably. Breathe in deeply and release your breath slowly. Repeat several times while concentrating on your breathing. Begin to read the scripture verse(s) slowly. Try reading out loud. Read through several times. Begin to record your feelings and response to the passage by identifying the few words that resonate. Ask yourself, why these words in particular? What does that word mean? What is happening in my daily life that relates to this scripture passage? How does the scripture make me feel: Tense? Calm? Anxious? Why?

The Lenten season is about reflection. If you are having difficulty, try reflecting while walking or while drawing or doodling. Relax and enjoy the process. As the psalmist told us: **Be still and know that I am God. Psalm 46:10.**
